Sharpening System for Sale

I have a sharpening system for sale.

Woodcut Tru grind jig with Record RPB6, and Veritas Grinder toolrest.

White wheel, red wheel and wheel dressing stone.

To buy new costs would be: Tru Grind jig £130, Record RPB6 £105 (now delisted), Veritas rest £68.

The Tru Grind allows sharpening of fingernail gouges as well as all standard gouge angles. The

Veritas jig is good for standard grind gouges, skews and parting tools.

For sale at £100. I will bring it to the next meeting, or contact me in advance if you want to come round to Thornton le Dale to look at the system.
