Emma Cook Demonstration Thursday 6 June

Another first class demonstration from Emma. I think it had something for everyone, with a range of turning techniques, advice on tools, plus examples of airbrushing decoration. I think what appeals about Emma's demonstrations is her explanation of what she is doing, and why she is doing it. Her advice on tools and equipment is also very useful.

With regard to equipment, the Oasser airbrush kit Emma used is currently on special offer, 40% off on Amazon, at £54. (sorry if you bought one from Emma at the normal price, though I believe she threw in a couple of extras). I will probably buy a couple at this price for the club shop.

It will be well worth watching again, considering the large amount of information and advice Emma got through.
