Hands On Night Thursday 30 April

Another successful evening with 8 lathes operating, two sharpening systems and a 3D printer. Geoff, who organised the evening, comments:

Measured by the positive response of our participants this was a happy, enjoyable and successful event. 29 members came along: 13 turners, 7 tutors and 9 others for an evening out. In addition we were treated to Pete Howells' interesting and engaging 3D printing demo and our turners came away with an interesting variety of finished or part finished projects. Enthusiasm was expressed for further events of this kind and, in addition to the upcoming 19th June Workshop Day at Ebberston, more hands-on evenings are planned for later in the year. None of this would be possible without the tutors' support and it goes without saying that this is much appreciated. To have attracted around 50% of our average monthly attendance is a feather in the club's cap and proof, if this were needed, that our club is about 'more than just a monthly demo'.

Second Hand Lathe

I have been given a Record DML24 as a donation to the club. It has all the extras, plus an early Nova chuck (spanners version) and tailstock centre. $\frac{3}{4}$ x 16tpi thread, 1MT tailstock. Bench top model. It used to belong to a former member of the club, John Provins, who worked at Plaxtons way back. His son would just like it to go to someone who can put it to some use. I would suggest £60 o.n.o. for it, which compares very favourably with similar models on eBay (the chuck itself is probably worth this). There are a few other tools which I will bring along to the next meeting, along with the lathe.



My first lathe was a Record DML36 (same model but longer than this one). I now use the headstock only, as a dedicated buffing machine.
