Also 10 books, all very good condition, a number still in print - classic reference material. £5 each. Also a Trend Airshield Pro respirator: as new, with battery, charger and filters, just no box. These masks have a very high APF – Protection Factor – rating, with a 98% filtration rate keeping virtually all dust away from the face.
